	 Rick Broun: Attended a GMA9 meeting last week in Bandera. A discussion of doing a water level study to help aid with the DFC took place during the meeting. The cost of the study would be split between participating Districts. The study would use well monitoring data collected from the District's and other District's within GMA9. Models would be using hard numbers instead of computer generated numbers. Recommends that the District participates. Al Broun: Brian Hunt is already working on setting base levels to identify stratus of aquifer

- Aqua Texas is going to evaluate the Lower Trinity. They have been asked if they would agree to continue the drilling into the Paleozoic in order to gather information on: 1)bottom seal and 2)fraction porosity
- The Lower Trinity project is divided into north and south. A north well has been drilled, logged and samples taken.
 Water samples have been sent in for chemical analysis.
- A big thank you to Ron Fieseler and his group for supplying geo logs, Rene Barker for water sampling, and Whisenant and Lyle for developing a tool for the district to use in getting water levels using an air line.

 Pat with Whisenant and Lyle is going to donate their transducer to the District once the telemetry equipment is installed.
