- **General Manager's Report of Activities:** DRC reported on:
 - **Complaints Received this month:**
 - Ryan Hills Subdivision (Central Texas Drilling on property to drill well without a registration, lot too small, they were stopped by HTGCD)
 - The Polo Club (lakes)
 - Keller Property (lakes)
 - McDonalds's Dripping Springs (Watering Drive in the middle of the Day)
 - **Increased Communication with:**
 - Jon Thompson with the City of Dripping Springs
 - Clint Garza with Hays County Subdivision Planning
 - Board Hearing Set for July 9, 2009.
 - The Hays County Grant Application was submitted on May 20, 2009
 - Attended the County Charette to discuss expected growth and attention to infrastructure to accommodate the growth.
- **Report from staff geologist Wesley Schumacher:**
 - Recent work was conducted with:
 - The Still Well ran a GAMMA log (paid for by BPGCD)
 - Spillar Well Correlation Cutting Description completed
 - BSEAD's Brian Hunt compiled potentiometric data for GMA9
 - Pulled 2 transducers and 2 E-lines for repair
- **Board & Staff Announcements:**
 - DAW announced the Isotope Age Study Results are in showing the Jacob's Well Base Flow Water at Cow Creek is approximately 2,000 – 3,000 years old. The Lower Trinity Analysis showed water approximately from (35,000) years old.
 - JAH requested Ken Davis update the Date on the Combined Well Monitoring Chart and adding a brief explanation.

-Elections of Board Officers: JAH recommends we have a Board Meeting Workshop to discuss priorities and direction of the District on June 11, 2009 and to conduct the elections of officers at the time.

AHB makes a motion to have a Board Meeting within two months, and elect officers at that time, and that JAH act as Board Secretary/Treasurer in the meantime. GFN seconds the motion. All in favor.

9:30am Workshop with Kay Beth Williams of Hays Central Appraisal District about Wildlife Valuations for property and supplemental water considerations:

Overview of Wildlife Exemption provided by Kay Beth Williams:

- Property is under Agricultural Exemption First for 5 years
 - Property capable of holding up to 3,000 pounds of animal weight
- 1995 Voters voted in Wildlife Exemptions
- July 2002 – 1st regulation for wildlife exemptions
- July 2006 Regulations updated
- 3 out of 7 Wildlife Criteria must be met
- Ponds and Lakes are not required (alternatives are RW retention/cattle troughs)
- Currently there are over 700 Wildlife Exemptions in Hays County or 10,000 acres
- Minimum Acreage required is 20 acres
- Erosion Control is not considered for pond development.
- Annual Review, or 5 to 7 year review periods established for audit

Others Groups to meet with to discuss HTGCD Rules and "Waste" of Water are:

Other Recommendations:

- Recommendation for lined lakes to include: Bentonite, Palm Sand, Phosphorous

- 1) **Variance to 042408 Resolution (no new permitted/non-exempt wells until MAG established) allowing 1-year permits for non-exempt wells requesting less than or equal to 20,000 gallons per year:**
Review of the Resolution 042408 based on a well registration for Dr. Ron White and permit application for 20,000 gallons per year.

DAW makes a motion to make a variance to the 042408 Resolution for non exempt wells requesting less than 50,000 gallons a year to be processed, and reiterated that wells must comply with rules for non-exempt wells including but not limited to the requirement that they must install a meter, and a Water-Level pvc pipe. AHB seconds. All in favor.
